Question #1: How did our Church get its name?

Answer: It is customary at the founding of a Church, for individuals and families to make donations to help establish the Church. The individual with the highest donation has the honor of naming the Church, usually for a Saint associated with the name of a family member. Two of the founders of the Church, Catherine "Rena" Sofos and Catherine Roumanis, decided to make a combined donation and were the highest donors. They named the Church Constantine, in honor of Catherine Roumanis's late husband, and Helen, in honor of Catherine Sofos's mother-in-law.

Question #2: Why are Catherine Roumanis and Catherine "Rena" Sofos called the Godmothers of our church?

Answer: It is the godparents who bestow the name at a baptismal service. The two Catherines bestowed the name of our Church and therefore they are referred to as the Godmothers of the Church.
